	white Mountain National Forest General Info The 800,000-acre White Mountain National Forest is a powerful presence in the White Mountains. A recreation fee is required for many of the sites in White Mountain National Forest. The daily pass is \$5.00. National Park holders of Interagency, Golden Age, or Golden Ageass passes are not required to purchase a White	
	or Golden Access passes are not required to purchase a White Mountain pass, however while parked at a fee site the card must be displayed on the dash of the pass-holder's vehicle. <a href="http://www.fs.usda.gov/main/whitemountain/passes-permits/recreation">http://www.fs.usda.gov/main/whitemountain/passes-permits/recreation</a>	
	If you do not have a National Park pass, you will purchase the daily pass at the site, Sabbaday Falls (Sep 30) and Diana's Baths (Oct 3). To pay the fee, you will need \$5 cash.

Thursday, Sep 28	Three Optional Activities: You may participate in 1, 2 or all 3 activities. If you plan to participate in the Flume Gorge and Cannon Mountain Aerial Tramway activities, you will want to purchase the combination Discovery Pass to save money. The Discovery Pass may be purchased at the Flume Gorge.	
8:30 am – 11:00 am	Optional Activity #1: The Flume Gorge (https://www.nhstateparks.org/visit/state-parks/flume-gorge.aspx) The Flume is a natural gorge extending 800 feet at the base of Mount Liberty. The walls of Conway granite rise to a height of 70 to 90 feet and are 12 to 20 feet apart. You may choose to just walk the boardwalk through the Gorge or extend your walk with a two mile loop.	
11:30 am – 1:00 pm	Optional Activity #2: Lunch at Polly's Pancake Parlor ( <a href="https://pollyspancakeparlor.com/">https://pollyspancakeparlor.com/</a> ) You may choose to be a Hobbit (from Lord of the Rings) and have a second breakfast with NH Maple Syrup (the real stuff that comes from the trees) or you may choose a salad, sandwich or quiche option. If you wish a different lunch option, on Rte 112 in Lincoln there are several places to dine varying from fast food to full service restaurants.	
1:30 – 4:00 pm	Optional Activity #3: Cannon Mountain Aerial Tramway (https://www.nhstateparks.org/visit/state-parks/aerial-tramway.aspx) The first passenger aerial tramway in North America began operation on this site in 1938. Almost seven million passengers were carried to the top by that first tram. We'll take the second tram which went into operation in 1980 for a scenic eight minute ride to the 4,200 foot summit of Cannon Mountain and enjoy panoramic views of the distant valleys and mountains. While at the top you may opt to hike to the observation tower.  No Campfire scheduled for tonight.	
Friday, Sep 29 9:45 am – 1:30 pm	Group Activity: Hobo Railroad  (http://www.hoborr.com/hobo.html) The Hobo Railroad travels through a natural setting along the Pemigewasset River. We will purchase tickets that include a Hobo picnic lunch and dine aboard the train.

<b>Saturday, Sep 30</b> 9:00 am – 3:00 pm	Optional Activity: Crawford Notch State Park Crawford Notch State Park has 5,775 acres providing access to numerous hiking trails, waterfalls, wildlife viewing, and spectacular mountain views. Crawford Notch State Park is also rich in history with the famous Willey House. (https://www.nhstateparks.org/visit/state-parks/crawford-notch- state-park.aspx)	
	In Crawford Notch State Park we will visit or hike the following sites or trails:  • Mount Washington Hotel - scenic view  • Visit Crawford Station Depot and view Elephant Head  • Hike the Saco Lake Trail (20 min) – easy hike  • Visit the Flume Cascade site  • Visit the Silver Cascade site  • Visit the Willey House site and have a picnic lunch  • Hike the Pond Loop Trail (10 min) Sam Willey Trail (30 min) -two easy hikes
